- an introduction to intelligence and the intelligence cycle
- · key elements of critical thinking
- inference development
- writing and presenting intelligence findings
- tactical, contrarian and strategic analytical techniques (e.g. Analysis of Competing Hypotheses and Key Assumptions Checks).

The content is designed to be suitable for beginners, but will be relevant to intelligence staff at all levels of experience. Case studies will be tailored toward environmental issues, and the program will conclude with a one-day scenario based exercise.
