

# STEERING COMMITTEE COMMUNIQUÉ

Meeting Communique #35 Melbourne, Victoria Friday 8 April 2016

### 1. MEMBER UPDATE

The Steering Committee was pleased to welcome two new international agencies to AELERT. Full membership, on a *pro bono* basis, was granted to the Solomon Islands' Ministry of Environment, Climate Change, Disaster Management and Meteorology. The Ministry is the first Australasian agency outside of New Zealand and Australia to join AELERT, strengthening the network's connectivity within the region. Affiliate membership was also granted to the Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment. The Ministry manages the Province of Saskatchewan's diverse landscapes and renewable natural resources in a manner that supports a healthy environment, a growing economy and strong, vibrant communities. The Canadian agency is AELERT's first member outside of Australasia, introducing a range of opportunities for international collaboration.

## 2. WEBSITE UPDATE

The Steering Committee was advised that the new AELERT website was achieved under budget. It was recommended that the under-spend be used to add a further interactive section on the Modern Regulator Improvement Tool to the site.

AELERT's web developers are busy working on the Toolkit and it should be available on the website very soon so keep an eye out for it!

### 3. UPCOMING WEBINARS

The Steering Committee was pleased to note the success of the Investigative Interviewing webinar and received recommendations on a range of operational and strategic themes for future webinars.

The committee determined that the next two webinars will cover:

- 1. The behavioural science behind offending; and
- 2. Communications and Engagement with a focus on the work being undertaken by the Communications and Engagement Working Group.

#### 4. TECHNOLOGY AND SURVEILLANCE

The Steering Committee was informed of the high level of member interest in the subject of technology and surveillance.

The committee resolved that a working group would be formed to lead the development and distribution of a survey seeking to determine current technology in use across the membership, as well as research future technology advances. The surveys will be hitting your inbox later this year.

It was further agreed that 'Technology' will be a stream at the next AELERT conference.

### 5. CLUSTER UPDATE

The Steering Committee noted the Cluster reports received by the Better Regulation Cluster, Legal Practice Cluster, Forestry Compliance and Enforcement Working Group and the Emergency Operations Cluster.

The committee acknowledged the excellent work being produced by the Clusters and thanked them for efforts.

#### 5.1. Forestry and Compliance Cluster Report

The Committee agreed that the Forestry and Compliance Cluster should hold an annual meeting and indicated their support by providing teleconferencing facilities.

Recently the working group held its first in a series of online seminars which focussed on the regulation of arboreal habitat in native forests in NSW. The next seminar in the series will look into how forestry regulators deal with the public side of regulation and how to deal with public outrage. Future seminars will be presented in the coming months and offered to members through the AELERT website.

#### 5.2. Operations Cluster

The Steering Committee considered the future direction of the cluster.

The committee agreed that a feasible solution for the management of the cluster was to create an 'Operations Portfolio', comprising of subject-specific working groups.

The formation of additional working groups was also encouraged by the Steering Committee. Working group suggestions proposed by members in response to the AELERT 2016 membership survey include:

- 1. Fisheries and agriculture.
- 2. Technology to research, trial and promote innovative technological advances.

The committee agreed that chairs of the working groups created under the Operations Portfolio would need to collaborate and report back to the committee.

It was resolved that the Commonwealth would lead in the creation of the Operations Portfolio.

#### 5.3. Communications and Engagement Working Group

Since the last Steering Committee meeting in October 2015, the establishment of the Communications and Engagement group has progressed. The Steering Committee approved the Communications and Engagement Working Group proposal to create a practical diagnostic communications tool.

This risk communication toolkit will allow members to identify the type of risk communication that is appropriate to their situation. The toolkit will draw on a range of existing resources and will provide hints and tips for agencies wishing to improve their communications performance.

Once the Toolkit has been finalised it will be made available to members on the AELERT website.

### 6. NEXT MEETING

The next Steering Committee meeting is scheduled for 4 August 2016. Items for inclusion on the agenda should be forwarded to the AELERT Secretariat by 21 July 2016.
